

## PPE Recommendations for Healthcare Personnel Caring for COVID-19 Positive Patients

PPE Item	Requirement	
Respirator	Fit-tested N95 or higher (e.g., PAPR, elastomeric respirator) for direct patient care.	
<b>Eye Protection</b>	Goggles or a face shield during close contact or when droplet exposure is possible.	
Gown	Long-sleeve isolation or disposable gown when contact with patient or contaminated surfaces is possible.	
Gloves	Non-sterile exam gloves for all patient care activities.	
<b>Patient Source</b>	Encourage patient (if able) to wear a medical mask during visits.

Aerosol-Generating	Use full enhanced PPE (respirator, eye protection, gown, gloves). Maximize		
Procedures	ventilation in the home.		
Donning & Doffing	Follow proper sequence. Perform hand hygiene to prevent self-contamination.		
Agency Risk Assessments   Maintain a policy. Be prepared to scale PPE practices during periods			
	increased respiratory virus activity.
